

# Radicalization Countermeasures

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security defines "radicalization" as the process of adopting an extremist belief system — including the willingness to use, support, or facilitate violence as a method to effect social change. The goal of this telecourse training video is to help peace officers understand the processes that can lead a person to support and pursue such violence. The program provides up-to-date information and tools to help prevent ideologically-based terrorist acts from occurring.

As part of the segments presented, officers will learn how someone may become radicalized, how to identify a person who has been radicalized, how law enforcement agencies work together in the fight against terrorism, how community policing can prevent radicalization, and learn what some terrorist targets may be in the local community.

The video program offers three viewing options:

1. Play video in its entirety (118 min.)
2. Select among 8 training segments:
  - Introduction (3 min.)
  - Historical Context (7 min.)
  - Myths and Reality (21 min.)
  - The Radicalization Process (23 min.)
  - Law Enforcement's Role (30 min.)

  - Final Thoughts (5 min.)

  - Possible Indicators of Homemade Explosives (1 min.)

  - Possible Terrorist Suspect (7 min.)
