Regulations 1004, 1005, 1081, and D-13

1004. Field Training Program.

[(a) Program Requirements – (d)(2)(B)2. Continued]

(3) FTOs will complete 8 hours of crisis intervention behavioral health training (CIBHT) as mandated by Penal Code section 13515.28.

13-7. Field Training Officer Crisis Intervention Behavioral Health Course Minimum Requirements

All Field Training Officers shall receive a minimum of 8 hours of crisis intervention behavioral health training within 180 days of appointment. The training shall minimally include the criteria in penal code section 13515.28.
