

ADDENDUM- INITIAL STATEMENT OF REASONS

Regulation 1052 Requirements for Course Certification

At the October 18, 2018 meeting, the Commission approved proposed changes to Regulation 1052, Requirements for Course Certification.

Further review of the content revealed additional changes were necessary to ensure consistency with existing language, clarify the process steps for approval and implementation of pilot presentations, and add factors for determining whether or not to approve and implement a pilot presentation. Justification for these changes is presented below.

Justification for Proposed Revisions

Regulation 1052(a)(9)(B)

- Adding subsection (a) to the Regulation reference is a non-substantive change but is necessary to ensure individuals are directed to the correct Regulation section.

Regulation 1052(g)

- Adding “amended” is necessary to ensure consistency with that same “amended curriculum” reference already in the regulation text.
- Listing each regulation section individually is necessary to ensure individuals are aware of only those regulatory sections that will impact the certification of a pilot presentation. The removal of the Regulation 1053 and 1057 references was necessary as these sections are specific to self-paced (online) courses and decertification. These sections do not include any information that would impact certification of a pilot presentation.
- Adding “approval and” is necessary to ensure it is clear the process being created is for both the approval and implementation of a pilot presentation.
- Changing “program” to “presentation” is necessary to ensure consistency with existing terminology in the regulation text.
- Reversing process steps two and three is necessary to reflect that determination of the need for a pilot presentation needs to come before approval to move forward with a pilot program.
- The changes made to step two are necessary to ensure the factors POST will take into account when determining whether or not to implement a pilot presentation are clear. All training curriculum, hours, and/or course certification requirements provided/required by POST must meet the needs of all stakeholders statewide, not just one specific group or agency, and must be able to be implemented statewide. These criteria are necessary to ensure no affected agency or presenter is negatively impacted by implementation of new training curriculum, hours, and/or course certification requirements at the conclusion of the pilot presentation. The components of the pilot presentation must work for all affected agencies or presenters. Including the cost to run the pilot presentation is also necessary to ensure POST has the funding necessary at the time of the request.
- Modifying step four is necessary to remove language already referenced in the regulation text.
- Adding “curriculum, hourly, and/or course certification” to step five is necessary to ensure consistency with language already referenced in the regulation text.
